CONTROL OF EMPLOYMENT (AMENDMENT) ACT, 2016

An act to exempt non belonger grandchildren of belongers born in Anguilla from the need to have work permits and for matters connected therewith.

[Gazette Dated: , 2016] [Commencement: Section 3]

ENACTED by the Legislature of Anguilla

Interpretation

1. In this Act—

“Act” means the Control of Employment Act R.S.A. c. C105.

Amendment of section 2 of the Act

2. Section 2 is amended by—

(a) substituting subsection (1) with the following—

“(1) No person shall—

(a) be employed in Anguilla for a salary, wage or other remuneration;
or

(b) engage in any occupation in Anguilla for profit or reward;

unless he is exempted under section 3 or he holds a valid work permit and he is employed or engaged in accordance with its terms.”;

(b) inserting the following as subsection (2)—

“(2) Subsection (1) does not apply to—

- (a) a person belonging to Anguilla;
- (b) the non-belonger grandchildren of belongers born in Anguilla; or
- (c) the husband or widower of a person belonging to Anguilla.”;

(c) inserting the following as subsection (3)—

“(3) Subsection (2) does not apply to a husband who is living apart from his wife as a result of a court order or a deed of separation.”; and

(d) renumbering subsections (2), (3) and (4) as subsections (4), (5) and (6).

Commencement

3. This Act is deemed to have come into force on the 3 day of March 2016.

Citation

4. This Act may be cited as the Control of Employment (Amendment) Act, 2016.
