

EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST: ADDITIONAL MAGISTRATE

DATE: 14 March 2023

Summary

The Governor of Anguilla is seeking to appoint up to three additional magistrates to form part of a reserve list for the magistracy of Anguilla. Sitting as the need arises, the additional magsitrates will provide appropriate leave cover to the Senior Magistrate and Magistrate. The appointments seek to ensure the effective administration of the work of the magistracy and to mitigate issues of availability and/or conflicts, by adding further individuals to the current pool of one additional magistrate.

Key responsibilities

- Convene and preside over the Coroner's Court, Magistrate's Court, Juvenile Court, Court of Summary Jurisdiction and Liquor Licensing proceedings.
- Perform the duties of the Coroner
- Authorise the removal of bodies and registrations of deaths.
- Serve as the Custodian of Enemy property.
- Approve the grant of liquor licences.
- Seize property in Civil cases.
- Carry out the functions of Magistrate and Marriage Officer.

Qualifications

Individuals are required to have a Bachelor's degree in law, or its equivalent, together with a legal education practice certificate and at least ten years of experience as a practising Barrister and/or Solicitor (Attorney at law) in Criminal and Civil law. Individuals must be admitted to practise in Anguilla or other territory or state within the jurisdiction of the Eastern Caribbean Supreme Court or Commonwealth country.



Individuals will need to be resident in Anguilla when sitting as a magistrate to provide leave cover to the Senior Magsitrate and Magistrate; and will need to be available to sit at potentially short notice.

Remuneration

Remuneration will be based on sitting days pro-rated on a salary of EC\$177,732.00 per annum. Reasonable travel and accommodation costs will be covered.
