DOGS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 2020

An act to amend the Dogs Act, R.S.A. c. D36

[Gazette Dated: , 2020] [Commencement: Assent under section 57 of the Constitution]

ENACTED by the Legislature of Anguilla

Interpretation

1. In this Act, "principal Act" means the Dogs Act, R.S.A. c. D36.

Amendment of section 14

- 2. The principal Act is amended in section 14 —
- (a) by inserting the phrase "commits an offence and" immediately after the word "he" where it occurs for the third time; and
- (b) by inserting the phrase "for each dog he is not authorised to keep" immediately after "\$1000."

Amendment of section 16

3. The principal Act is amended in section 16(2) by deleing "250" and substituting it with "\$750".

Amendment of section 18

- **4.** The principal Act is amended—
- (1) in section 18(1) by inserting the phrase "or a police officer" immediately after the word "Officer" where it occurs.
- (2) in section 18(4) by deleting "any land" and substituting it with "land other than private land"

OBJECTS AND REASONS (The objects and reasons do not form part of the Bill)

The objects and reasons of this Bill are to amend the Dogs Act to discourage dog owners from having their dogs at large, being a threat to public safety and the safety of other animals and property. The Bill clarifies that the fine in relation to unlicensed dogs is for each dog; increases the fine for having unleashed dogs in public and stray dogs; authorises a police officer to destroy any dog who is seen attacking a person or animal and restricts persons from laying chemicals for dogs on land other than their own
