# INF 17/06 INFORMATION NOTE:- NATIONAL FUNERAL FOR THE LATE MS. JULIETTE HAWLEY IN RECOGNITION OF HER INVALUABLE CONTRIBUTION TO ANGUILLA DURING THE REVOLUTION

Hon Parliamentary Secretary remained in attendance.

Council noted the passing of Ms. Juliette Hawley of East End. Ms. Juliette Hawley was one of the many women who stood by the side of Mr James Ronald Webster during the Anguilla Revolution. One account of her bravery was when Mr Tony Lee was coming to Mr Webster's office, Ms. Hawley was there with her fellow protestors holding a banner which read, "No Tony Lee here today." When the trucks needed to be filled with rocks to be used as weapons she was there to lend a hand. Saving and securing Anguilla was the focus at that time and she played her part not for awards or ceremonies, but out of her deep love for her beloved Anguilla.

The late Ms. Juliette Hawley was awarded with the Anguilla Badge of Honour and Queen's Certificate in 2016 for her outstanding contribution to the Anguilla Revolution.

In keeping with EX MIN 14/612 (vii) and EX MIN 15/535, the Ministry of Home Affairs has therefore begun the process of making arrangements which will include:-

- (i) the holding of a National Funeral for the late Ms. Juliette Hawley on Saturday December 9<sup>th</sup>, 2017 in collaboration with the family. The funeral will take place at the St. Augustine's Anglican Church at East End beginning at 3:00 pm;
- (ii) the publication of an official Statement of Condolence from the Government and people of Anguilla on the passing of this revolutionary;
- (iii) flags to be flown at Half Mast on the day preceding the funeral and on the day of the funeral until immediately following the funeral ceremony;
- (iv) a Police Guard of Honour to be drawn up at the Church and a contingent of uniformed officers to bear the body in and out of the church and at the graveside. Casket to be covered with the national flag; and
- (v) a contribution of EC\$5,000 towards the cost of the funeral expenses and EC\$3,000 towards the other expenses.
