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Chairperson's Foreword

13 January 2016

The Public Accounts Committee of the House of assembly is crucial to ensuring appropriate scrutiny of the way in which Anguilla's public finances are managed and conserved. I am privileged to be its chair and I am fortunate in having able colleagues, as committed, I believe, to the task as I am.

On 20th June 2014, Don Mitchell QC, in a letter to Father of the Nation, James Ronald Webster, said: "The system of government that we have inherited seems almost designed to encourage us to give up our natural integrity once we achieve political power".

The Public Accounts Committee (PAC) was established at the Fourth Meeting of the First Session of the Eleventh Anguilla House of Assembly, on Tuesday, 22nd September 2015, in accordance with section 66A of the Legislative Assembly (Procedure) Rules, 1976. As the Speaker acknowledged, the PAC had never functioned properly, if at all, nor had it been given any recognition in the past.

The purpose of a PAC is to prevent waste or misappropriation of public funds and to ensure transparent accounting and reporting of government expenditure. The PAC is supported, in an Overseas Territory such as Anguilla, by the Auditor General, who is an external auditor and who should therefore be free of influence from Anguilla's politicians. He is appointed by the Governor without control by any local body such as Executive Council. His Report is laid before the House of Assembly.

The PAC uses the Auditor General's Report to examine how public funds were spent. Questions are asked by the PAC and inefficiencies or irregularities can be highlighted. By this means, civil servants are empowered to resist any unauthorised expenditure. To accomplish its objective, the PAC must be well informed, vigilant and active. It is notorious that the PAC has never functioned effectively in Anguilla.

With this in view, as Chair of the PAC I have already attended a course in London developed by the International Centre for Parliamentary Studies which led to a Professional Certificate in the Work of Public Accounts Committees and, in February, I and other members of the PAC and its officer, together with the Leader of the Opposition in the Anguilla Youth Parliament, will go to London to meet with members of the UK PAC, the UK Audit Office, representatives of the World Bank Parliamentary Strengthening Programme and other stakeholders, with a view to gaining more experience in this field and cementing long-term supportive relationships.

It will be our objective to identify key challenges Anguilla faces in implementing international best practices related to financial scrutiny, and to identify practical ways to implement them in the Anguilla context.

It is notable that PACs suffer similar shortcomings even in independent Commonwealth Caribbean countries. That the PAC works well in Bermuda is a credit to that community from which I hope we can learn lessons.

The public want more transparency and they want government to be more accountable. I intend that this Anguilla PAC should take bold steps in that direction. If I can sum up my objectives for the Anguilla PAC, I would say they include the following, although the list may well expand during the course of our work:

- As committee members, we are all united in the quest for value for money in public spending.
- One of our priorities must be to secure buy-in for our objectives by all civil servants involved, together with a change in the relationship between Ministers and Civil servants in terms of responsibility for ensuring proper accountability. We are not unique in having this need; the PAC in London faces the same challenge, albeit on a larger scale.
- We must hold government to rigorous account; not merely ministers, who are here today
 and gone tomorrow, but civil servants who are responsible for the execution of policy on a
 longer term basis.
- We need to demonstrate to the Anguillian public that we are effective in achieving our objectives, by drilling down to the true facts, by identifying major systemic failures which I believe exist in our current systems and by reporting our findings in a transparent and open way.
- We are not interested in lining shelves with reports that don't make a difference. We intend to be the first ever effective Anguillian PAC and to make a difference.
- We shall highlight success and achievements where we find them and we hope that the
 civil service will embrace the opportunity to show the Anguilla public beyond all reasonable
 doubt that they are on the people's side in the quest for properly regulated public finances,
 providing value for money and equal opportunities to all.

Introduction
