Anguilla: Hotel Occupancy Rates 1st Quarter: Jan – Mar 2003

The average occupancy rate for hotels for the period January to March 2003 was 55.0% compared to 50.9% in 2002 and 49.0% in 2001.

Occupancy for February and March 2003 averaged 54.8% and 56.6% respectively compared to 53.3% and 55.5% respectively in 2002. For the 1st quarter 2003 Tourist arrivals were down 5.6% compared to the same period in 2002, but tourists visited for a longer period during this time than they did during the same period last year.

Occupancy rates at large hotels (with 51+ rooms) were at near to full capacity. They also showed the largest increase for this period. The medium sized (20 to 50 rooms) category increased in occupancy for the 1st quarter by 10.3% while small hotels (those with less that 20 rooms) increased by 4.4%.

Occupancy rates for small hotels for this 1st quarter 2003 averaged 35.3% compared to 33.8% in 2002. Large hotels showed an 8.8% increase from January to March relative to last year. This category had a combined average occupancy of 85.2%, while hotels with 20 to 50 rooms averaged 44.6% occupancy for this period compared to 40.4% last year.
